

# FROM POSSESSION TO MURDER CASE : A RICHMOND STORY

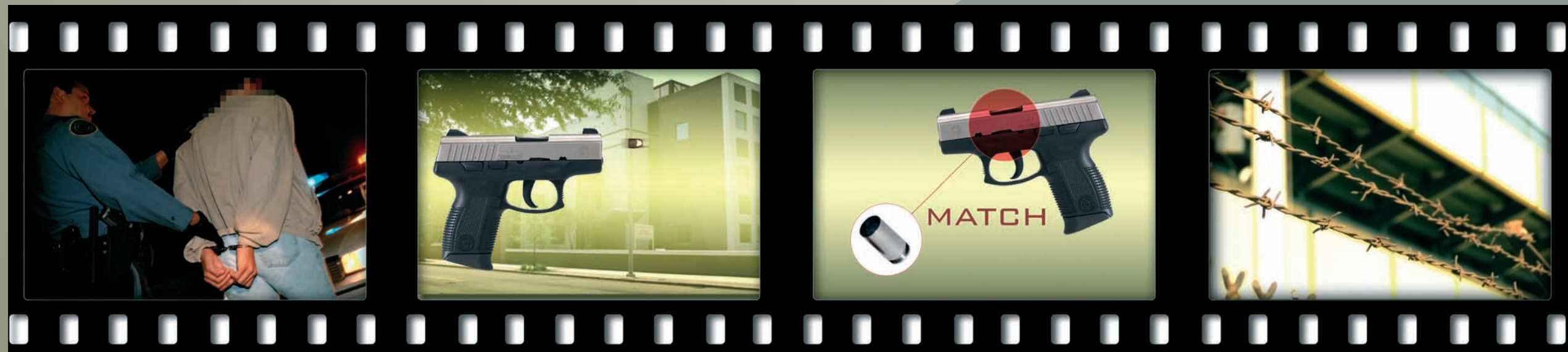


April 2004, Richmond Police responded to the area of Pine and Broad Streets on the report of shots fired.

At the scene, police found Jose Andujar Jr. slumped behind the wheel of a vehicle dead from an apparent gunshot wound to the chest.

Three men who had been in the vehicle with the victim told police that they saw another vehicle drive by and that the occupants opened fire on the victim's car.

Police recovered 9 m/m cartridge cases from the scene and submitted them to the Virginia Department of Forensic Science where IBIS operators entered them into the NIBIN database.



May 2004, the Virginia Commonwealth University Police arrested Keyon Starling for illegal possession of a Taurus, 9mm pistol on West Broad Street in Richmond.

The pistol was forwarded to the Virginia Department of Forensic Science in Richmond for examination and test firing.

At the lab, IBIS operators queried the NIBIN database and linked a test fire from the Taurus pistol to the cartridge case evidence from the Andujar murder.

An investigation resulted in the arrest and conviction of Keyon Starling for the murder of Jose Andujar Jr.
